- If you choose not to accept the offer of employment with Achieve, your employment with Mercy Community will terminate however, you will not be entitled to any payment with respect to redundancy.


Our operation general managers, **Ainsley** and **Karen**, and PPC team members, **Alicja Byrnes** and **Carrie Evans** remain available to meet with you.

You may meet IHA's Customer Engagement Manager Rebecca Egan at some stage. Beck, as she is best known, brings a wealth of experience in tenancy and SDA management and will be the main point of contact for families and guardians.
